## Soror Spotlight: Tennayara Tordan

Soror Jennaydra Jordan was recently crowned Mrs. Brooklyn in the Mrs. New York America (MNYA) pageant. She will participate in the 2019 competition, which celebrates the achievements of mothers. The winner will have the opportunity to create a platform for a community service endeavor. In this Soror Spotlight, Soror Jordan describes the different phases of her involvement in MNYA. She also considers the greater role of the competition in acknowledging the work of women across New York and the rest of the United States who are committed to service. Her responses to the interview questions appear below.

### Q: When were you initiated?

**A:** I was initiated into the Lambda Gamma Chapter at the University of Delaware in the fall of 1997.

### Q: What attracted you to Delta Rho Omega?

A: In the early 2000s, I began visiting Delta Rho Omega while I was in law school because one of my dear friends, Audra Polk. She was very active in this chapter and was then Chair of the Pink and Green Ball. I immediately became involved helping Audra with the Ball, which is one of the reasons why it is so dear to me. I really enjoyed working with the amazing Sorors in Delta Rho Omega. They were so sisterly and admirable! To this day, I feel like I am with family whenever I am with my dear Delta Rho Omega Sorors.

## Q: What motivated you to become a contestant in the Mrs. New York America (MNYA) pageant?

I think it is important for us to celebrate women who want to take an active role in bettering our world. As a wife, attorney, and a mom, it feels like I already have three full-time jobs. However, I believe in encouraging those women who want to take on another role by working in the community to support and encourage those in need. As Alpha Kappa Alpha women, we do it without second thought because it is our nature. But it really is a serious matter because we all can make the world a better place by volunteering.

### Q: How are you preparing for the upcoming competition in 2019?

It really takes a village to prepare for a pageant of this magnitude. I am fortune that I have Sorors who have competed before and are providing me with insight and encouragement. I am also focused on being the best physically and mentally fit me that I can be.
